

Dr. Jeffrey Phillips



Qualified in Medicine from St. Mary's Hospital/Imperial College, London (with a BSc in the History of Medicine from University College, London). He trained in Anaesthetics and Intensive Care at St. Bartholomew's and University College Hospitals, London and their associated hospitals.

Since 2000 he has been Director of Intensive Care and Consultant Anaesthetist at Princess Alexandra Hospital, Harlow, Essex and is also currently Lead Doctor in Anaesthetics. From 2003 to 2005 he was Clinical Development Director for the Trust and Deputy Medical Director.

He was Medical Lead for the Essex Critical Care Network since its formation as one of the twelve National pilot sites under the direction of the NHS Modernisation Agency Critical Care Programme in February 2001 until 2007. The Network has been involved in the introduction and development of several schemes which have now been adopted nationally including Care Bundles, Discovery Interviews and Capacity and Demand Modelling. In January 2003 he became an Associate Member of the NHS Modernisation Agency.

Dr. Phillips is a Visiting Fellow in Critical Care Medicine at Anglia Ruskin University.

In March 2006 he was asked to be the National Clinical Champion for Infection Control (Critical Care) for the Department of Health.
